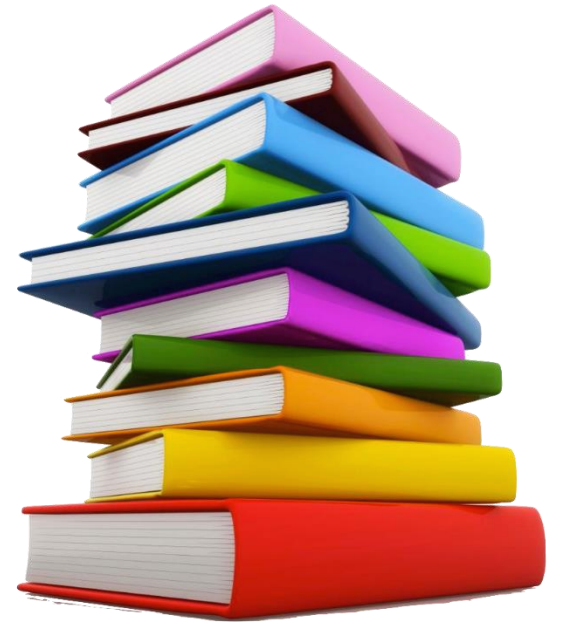

Phonics - Lesson 1

Can you think of a trigraph ?

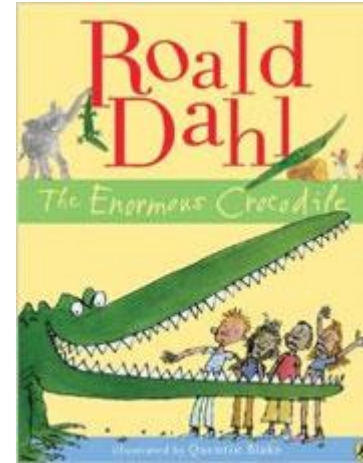
Read the poem slowly and carefully together with an adult. Can you use your phonic knowledge to sound out the words and blend them together.

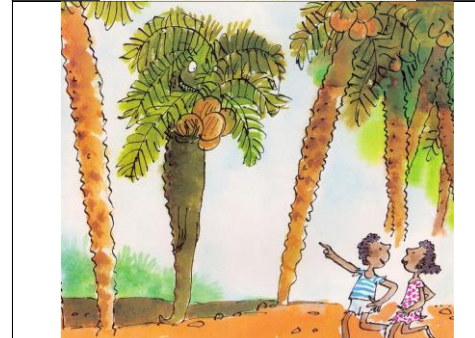
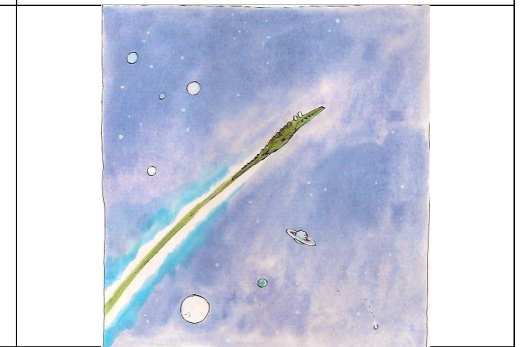
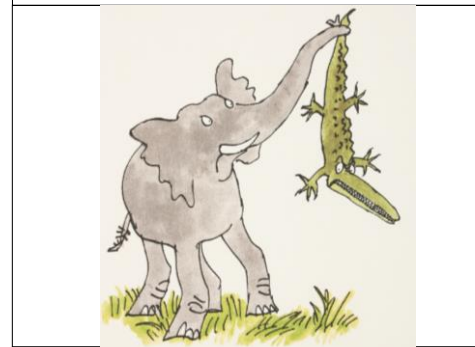
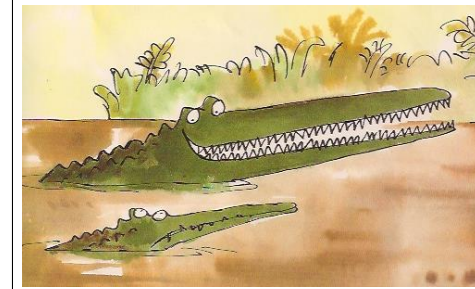
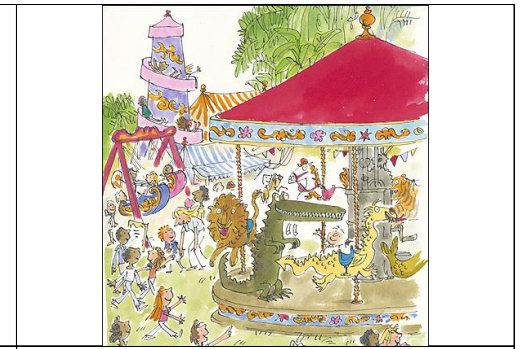


Task -
