


Looking around a Mosque







The dome is often placed directly above the main prayer hall.



The dome is sometimes decorated with gold.




The inside of the dome can be decorated with gold, beautiful patterns and Arabic writing.




Mihrab is an alcove in the Qiblah wall showing the direction to face towards Mecca when praying.




Mihrab is where the Imam (leader) stands in the alcove to deliver prayers.




Minbar is where the Imam stands when delivering a sermon after Friday prayers.




The Imam stands on one of the lower steps to deliver the prayers, the top step is saved for the prophet.




The call for prayer is called from the top of the minaret by the Imam (leader).





When Muslims pray, they do so on a prayer mat. Men and women pray in separate areas.



In a mosque the prayer hall is usually carpeted so they don't need to bring mats.



Before going into the mosque, everyone must remove their shoes.



Before going into the mosque, everyone must wash their hands, feet and mouths. There are separate washing areas for men and women.
