You can use Snapseed to edit your photographs.

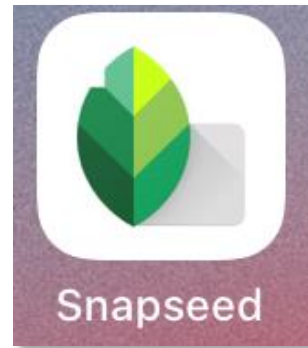
Let's do

1. Open the Snapseed app.
2. Tap anywhere to open a photo.
3. Choose 'Open from device' to choose a photo from the **camera roll**.
4. Tap the tools tab to see the editing tools and start editing.

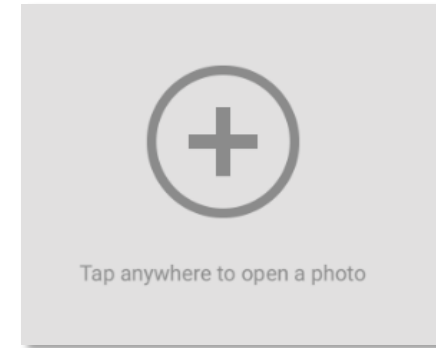

Let's do

You can also **crop** your photos.

1. Tap the tools tab and choose 'Crop'.
2. Crop your photo by pinching in from the corners or sides.
3. Tap the tick to accept the changes. You can tap the cross to reject them.



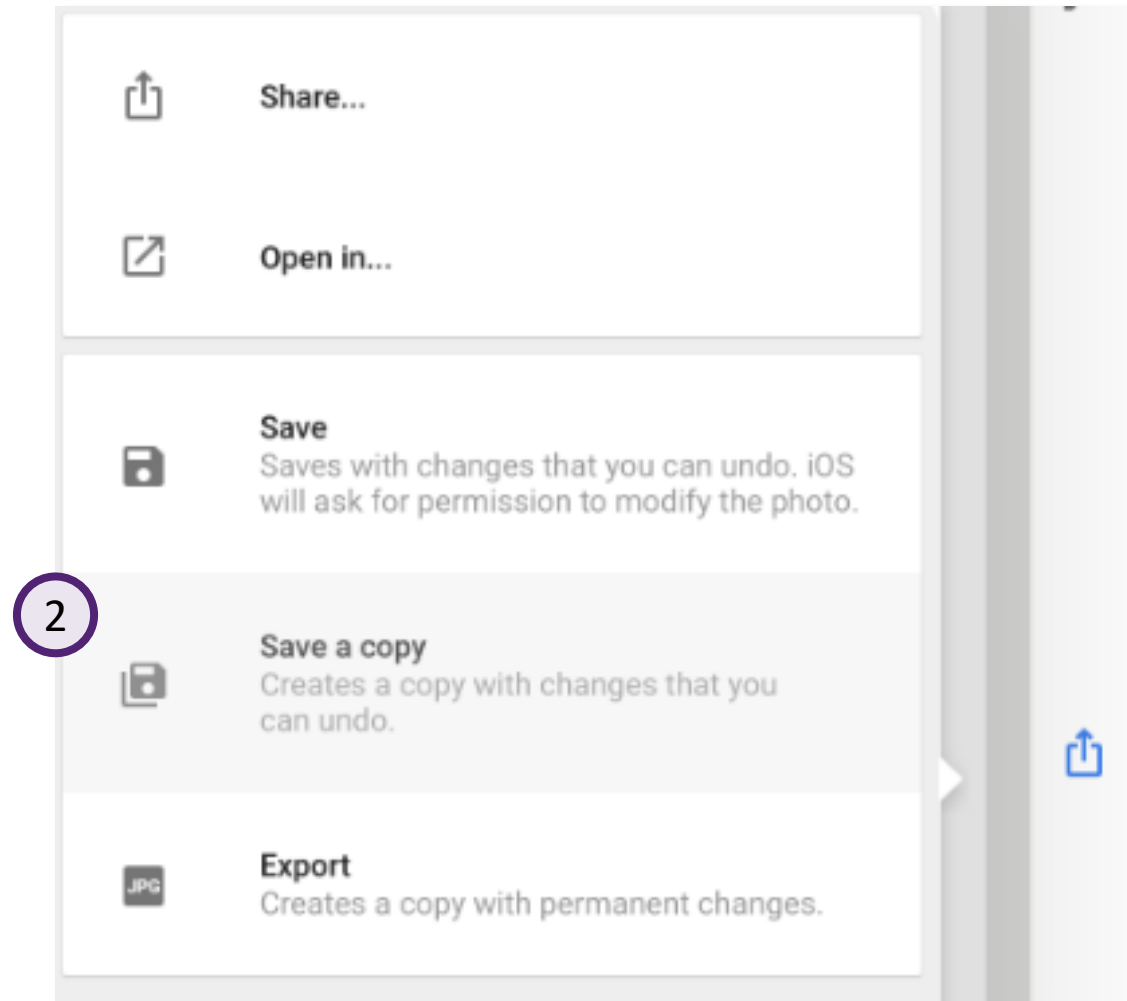

In Snapseed, you can save the changes by saving a copy. This does not change the original photo. It creates instructions for how a copy of the photo is to be changed.

1. Tap on the 'Save' tab.
2. Choose 'Save a copy'.



Let's do

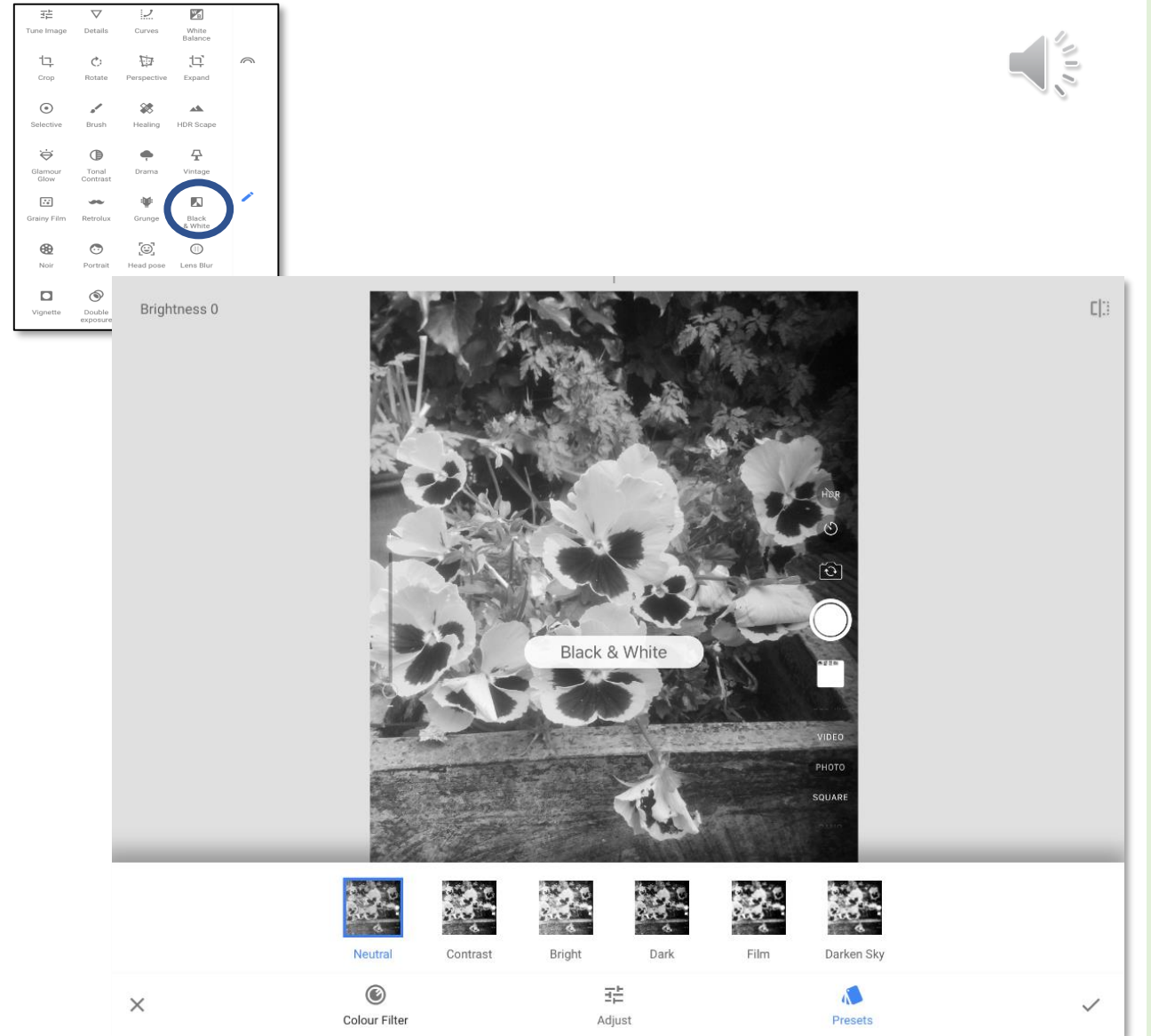
You can **filter** your photo using the filter options.

1. Tap the 'Tools' tab and choose a filter such as 'Black & White'.
2. Experiment with other filter effects.

Remember that 'less is more' in photo editing. Don't get too carried away with making changes. Always remember to save changes you want to keep.

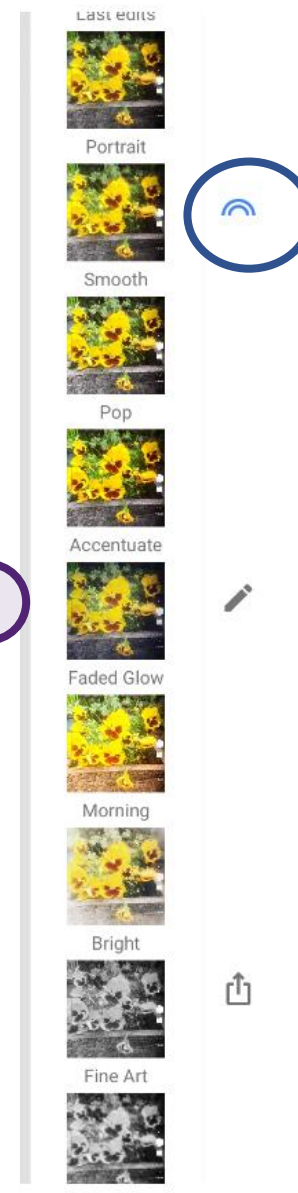




Let's do

You can also filter your photo using the rainbow icon.

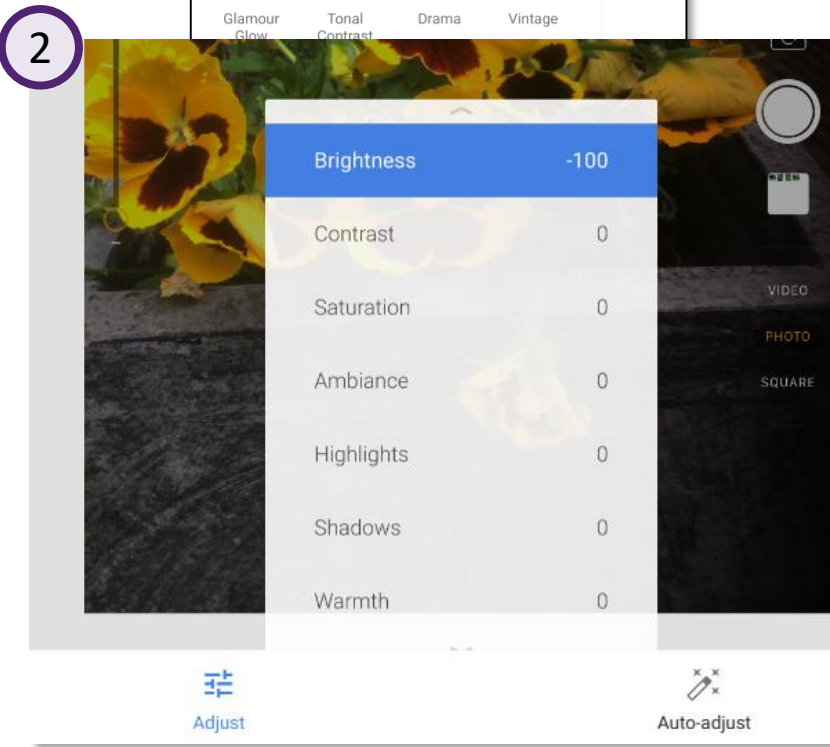
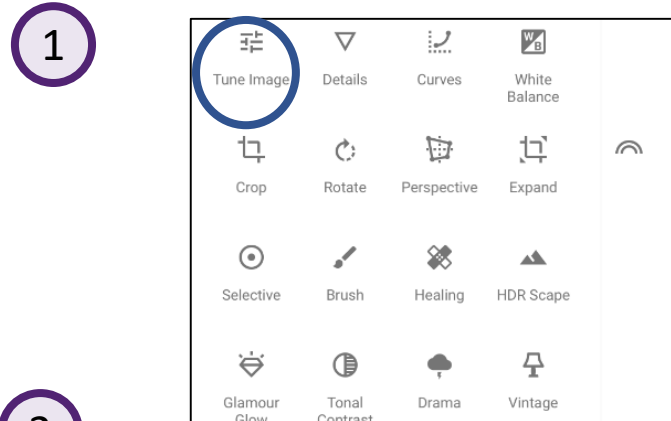
1. Tap the rainbow icon.
2. Choose an effect.

You can make **adjustments** to images too.

1. Choose 'Tune Image' in the tools tab.
2. This will then give you the option to auto-adjust or to choose an adjustment, such as brightness. Swipe left or right to adjust.
