




Today we would like you to think about a time when you have lost something. It could be a toy or part of a game, anything that you have lost in the past.




English - Lesson 2

They all have double letters, which are consonants before the le.




Finally, I got a parcel through the post. I was so surprised because my teddy bear had been sent back to me from the hotel! They had found it for me!
