# Engayne home learning planning framework

This is the plan for a learning sequence, within each box is the information and resources you need for the sequence and are spilt into sessions.

Down the left hand side of the page are the metacognitive strategies we have been teaching the children that are particularly important to home learning.

### Metacognitive strategies

Foundation Tasks (offline and online)

### Activate

## Monday:

<u>PE</u> Do a Joe Wicks lesson (via YouTube) or activities on TopYa! You may want to set up your own circuit. Alternatively, you may want to have a go at something calmer such as a Cosmic Yoga for Kids (via YouTube).

This week we will be practising a dance for dance morning. If you can remember the start of the dance then you may want to listen to our song and practise the start. The song we are dancing to is By your side by Calvin Harris ft Tom Grennan. However, don't worry if you can't remember our dance. You can have a go trying to make up your own to the song instead!

#### Explain



Explicitly teaching strategies to pupils and helping them decide when to use them.

## **Tuesday:**

## RE

Read through the document titled 'Faith through arts PP'. This explains that in Christianity they use all sorts of art to represent their spirituality. Such as singing in church, sculptures, paintings and stained glass windows.

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Practise



Pupils practising strategies and skills repeatedly, to develop independence. Focusing on one art (Singing, dancing, paintings etc) can you research how other religions use this art.

For example, you may want to google 'How do Hindus express their faith through dance'. Make notes on what you find.

Always remember when researching on the internet to do so safely by writing 'for children' at the end of your search.

Reflect



Pupils reflecting on what they have learnt after they have completed a piece of work. Wednesday:

Continue with your research from yesterday. Once you have found some information then please try and create a way to display this information. This could be by writing a mind map, creating a poster or a PowerPoint presentation.
